

## Welcome to the Romans Project!

We trust that you will enjoy the wonderful adventure of reading Romans repeatedly and hand-copying it in your own handwriting!

In-case you are very busy, below are some tips or suggestions on how you can make steady and sure progress so as to complete the project in 20weeks/ 5 months.

Ideally, we encourage you to make time to read Romans in one sitting from Chapter 1 to 16. This for many people is not easy but in the course of your repeated reading we encourage you to try it at least once out of the 20 required rounds of reading.

1. Aim at reading at least 4 chapters every day, you could read two chapters in the morning and two in the evening or other convenient time. When you do this you'll take four days to read through the entire book of Romans and then you can do the same the next week or just continue when you finish a round of reading. Keep a record of each time you complete a round of reading so that you know when you have completed 20 rounds of reading.
2. We encourage you to at least read through the entire book of Romans ten (10) times before you begin hand-copying it. We have discovered that in the NIV, Romans has 31 sections. So if you are busy, when you begin hand-copying, you could copy a section a day and you will be done in 31 days and the experience will be very rewarding!
3. Each time you read through Romans, note down a verse, a thought or a lesson that God is teaching you. This will help you when you come to writing down three things that God has taught you through your reading and writing of Romans.

We will do our best to stay in-touch with you on a monthly basis to encourage you in your in-depth Bible study adventure through Romans.
